Baseball and other Sports Career:

Played varsity level sports in high school baseball, football, basketball and track.

Played 7 consecutive years in the Men's Senior Baseball (amateur) League (MSBL) at Travis Field in Bryan, TX (pitcher, 1b and outfield). It was during these years I had the opportunity to play summer seasons with college level, ex-professional and semi-professional baseball players and really evolved into a student of the game in which I learned tons of mechanics involving all facets of the game that I was never subjected to growing up small town. The more I learned the better and better I got as a player. By age 33, my son was reaching tball age and I decided to hang it up and retire from amateur baseball. This was also around the time when the BV Bombers came in and took over control of Travis Field and forced MSBL out. We played a lot at Anderson/Shiro high school after that, but it was more like homerun derby cause of such a short porch.

When my son hit age 4 I began coaching/managing tball at Bryan Harvey Little League. Did this for 2 seasons and this is where it became apparent I had the gift of teaching kids basic and sound fundamental of baseball. My tball teams were unstoppable. When my son hit 7u we had just made a move to Montgomery, TX where I jumped in and began coaching/managing my son's 7u

Little League machine pitch teams and again from 7u to 9u my teams were unstoppable. By the time my son was 8u, I had begun giving private lessons to kids ranging from 4 to 9 years old just by word of mouth and people approaching me and asking me for help.

I also served on the Montgomery LL Board of directors as the Executive Secretary for 2 years.

As of fall 2019 my son Colby joined 12 College Station which is opening up the door for me to utilize my talent to teach kids how to play the game I love so much.

The kids I left behind in Montgomery upon returning to BCS are all solid, successful ball players.
